




Leomie Anderson

"You are valid, you can do anything, you are intelligent, and you deserve to be heard...Just be unapologetically yourself and remember your voice matters."


This is what south London model Leomie Anderson wants young girls to know, especially young black girls.





Developed our oracy skills

This term we have been introducing new elements to our oracy curriculum. This work has been led by year 5 teacher Sally Doughty and has been a part of our work with Voice 21.



The Oracy Framework, devised by Voice 21 and Oracy Cambridge, provides a structure through which we can understand what constitutes good speaking and listening in different contexts. It breaks down the skills within oracy into four distinct but interlinked strands:

WFA Reading Curriculum Evening

Thursday 2nd November 2023

We need your support and engagement!

Dear families,

We would like to invite you to an evening workshop looking at how we teach and support all children in developing their reading. The evening is designed to give you further insight into the learning here at Wallscourt Farm Academy and help you think about how you can continue to work with us to support children in their learning.

The evening will be held on Thursday 2nd November and will run slightly differently for families of children in Oak Learning Zone (our reception class) to those with children in year groups 1 to 6. The evening for year groups 1 to 6 will include a whole school address from the principal, Charlotte Black, about the curriculum and being a reader at WFA. Following this, families will be directed to their child's year group for a session about being a reader in that learning zone. The evening will run as follows:

- 5.30 pm whole school address in the Super Classroom
- 6.00 pm families make their way to the year group they would like to find out more about
- 6.30 pm end of evening



For our families in Oak Learning Zone, the evening will begin at 6pm for an address from the principal, Charlotte Black, about early years and the WFA curriculum. Following this, the Oak teaching team will share key information about the early years curriculum, phonics and reading. This will all take place in the Super Classroom and will end between 6.30 and 7.00 pm depending on running times.

It is really important that families attend these workshops if possible as they are designed to support you in helping the children with their reading at home. This forms part of our learning triangle approach where the partnership with families is fundamental to our ethos. We have planned for this evening to take place before our Family Learning Conferences so that families can hear about reading progression and support prior to the conversations about your child's progress.

This will be the first of 2 curriculum evenings that we will hold this year at WFA. The second curriculum evening will take place later in the year and will be based on how WFA supports and challenges learners across the curriculum.

We look forward to seeing you during this first meeting and working together to support your child's learning journey.

Chinese New Year




We hope to be able to invite The University of Bristol Chinese Lion Dance Troupe back to Wallscourt Farm Academy to perform for us.

Jewellery

Important Reminders:

Birthdays

We will always make your child feel special on their birthday. We request that you **do not** send sweets or **chocolates** into school or give them out at the end of the day.

Sunglasses and Sun cream

In warm weather, we encourage children to wear sun cream as they are outside for at least 30 minutes at lunchtime. If you would like your child to apply their own sun cream, please provide a named bottle of cream. An adult will supervise the application, but we are not allowed to put it on your child for them. We request that your child does not wear sunglasses unless arranged with the school due to hay fever or allergies.

Trim Trail and Monkey Bars

Please **do not** let your child use any of the outdoor equipment at the beginning or end of the school day. This equipment is for use during learning time only.

Due to serious allergies, we are a **nut and** seed free school – please do not send these items into school as part of a packed lunch.

Please only book a holiday during school holidays. **We do not authorise holidays taken during term time.** <u>Unauthorised absence may result in a fixed penalty fine.</u>
