1.	Introduction, Administration, and Apologies	
1.1	The meeting was opened by the Chair, and all were welcomed. The meeting was	
	deemed quorate.	
1.1.2	NL advised that Jenny Bye is running late. No apologies were received from Yana	
	Palaguta.	
2.	Declarations of Interest	
2.1	None	
3.	Minutes of Previous Meeting	
3.1	Minutes were confirmed. Actions are listed at the end of the document.	
4.	Matters Arising	
4.1	Curriculum Presentation from Charlotte Black	
4.1.1	An outcome from our last OFSTED review was for us to develop Middle Leadership.	
	We have made changes around planning and we are incorporating the new CLF	
	curriculum.	
4.1.2	Subject leaders are implementing joy filled learning and want to create learners who	
	can think for themselves.	
4.1.3	Our curriculum intent is a 6 week planning cycle. We've been focusing on writing and	1
	have linked with a South Glos English Specialist. The first 3 weeks (of the 6 week cycle)	
	is focused on being an author, discreetly teaching writing, whilst the second weeks (of	
	the 6 week cycle) is 'writing to learn', ie to 'write like a Scientist'.	
4.2	What other parts of the curriculum gets pushed to the second 3 weeks of the 6 week	
	cycle?	
4.2.1	(CB) Science, Geography etc. Writing throughout WFA was not performing well, but	
	now we don't need to teach literacy in the second 3 weeks (of the 6 week cycle)	
	because this has been covered in the first 3 weeks.	
4.2.2	(SW) It gives us a great opportunity to focus.	
4.3	Are the other Academies doing the same teaching?	
4.3.1	(SW) Each Academy is different. Some are teaching each subject, some are teaching	
	one week intensive. Our Academies all follow the same curriculum, but the specialists	
	in the schools are best placed to implement the teaching.	
4.3.2	(CB) We still have purposeful, joy filled learning and often combine 2 subjects ie,	
	Science and Music or Science and Geography. Our Yr4 students produced a Silent Film	
	with a soundtrack.	
4.4	Are the Enquiries (Projects/Topics) planned over 39 weeks?	
4.4.1	(CB) Yes. The second 3 weeks (of the 6 week cycle) Our Literacy Lead has met with a	
	teacher from each year group and mapped out the enquiries over 39 weeks. I've met	
	with our Middle Leaders.	
4.4.2	(CB) Subject Leaders should be an expert of the curriculum. In Primary school you may	
	be leading a subject that you don't have a degree in, investing in your subject leaders	
	is key to continuing to develop a deep understanding of the curriculum.	
4.4.3	Our 39 week plans are complete for all year groups, and contain all CLF content.

4.5	Do we give time to the Middle Leaders to develop and research the subjects they	
	lead if they are not qualified in that areas?	
4.5.1	(CB) Yes, via our Primary cluster meetings.	
4.5.2	(SW) We match our teachers with Secondary teachers. Workshops are available at	1
	PAC which are run by subject leads. Our History subject lead (at WFA) has a History	
	degree, is a former curator and was heavily involved I the writing the CLF curriculum.	

4.5.3	(CB) We have a further document for 39 weeks that outlines the focus for each year	
	group. We have invited our subject leaders to the SLT meeting to help build expertise	
	and this enables the SLT to lend support and training.	
4.5.4	(SK) This is also good practice for the subject leaders to present in front of the SLT. There	
	are exciting challenges for teachers and students working from a high quality model.	
4.6	Do the teachers have a chance to tweak the plans?	
4.6.1	(CB) Yes of course, keeping it relevant day to day. It can be tweaked via the cohort and	
	community. We've made changes along the way.	
4.6.2	(SK) Our writing is improving rapidly.	
4.6.3	(SW) We've been responsive to the ARV (Academy Review Visits)	
4.6.4	(CB) We look at how the plans are being implemented. We have done book looks and	
	looked at learning journeys and ensured that the plans have been followed. We've	
	carried out Pupil Voice and found that there was some confusion on the learning focus,	
	but this has been rectified and we are learning from this.	
4.6.5	(SK) Teachers sometimes find it a little difficult to let go of the writing focus during the	
	second 2 weeks (of the 6 week cycle)	
4.6.6	(SW) The depth of curriculum thinking at WFA is very strong and has been acknowledged	
	as a real strength here. During Scrutiny we were asked how the Academy Council are	
	informed of the curriculum, we think it would be great for the Link Councillors to ask	
	about this during visits.

5.1	Student Outcomes	
5.1.1	(SK) We had significant increases in writing, our mocks outcomes were very good. Our	
	homegrown Yr6 children are doing very well. Children that have joined us from other	
	schools are doing less well.	
5.1.2	(SW) We have delved into the results right to the individual pupil at Primary level; the	
	attainment journey at WFA is strong.	
5.1.3	(SK) It is heartening that the children have had a really great curriculum, and they have a	
	positive attitude to learning.	
5.2	What is the National Average for Reading?	
5.2.1	(SK) 75% - WFA are well above the NA. All children are above the NA. We are slightly	
	below on Writing and Maths, although the full curriculum for Maths has not yet been

5.2.2	(HR) Children are doing harder tests right now	
5.2.3	(SK) Its really exciting having Yr6. Its great seeing their joy at learning and coming to	
524	school. We've recently held auditions for our Musical Theatre production, Joseph.	
5.2.4	(HR) We have had over 50 children from Yrs5 & 6 take part in the auditions.
